





GOAL: By 2035, 15% per capita reduction from 2005 levels of GHG levels from autos and light trucks




Priority Development Areas








Job Growth Forecast, 2010-2040






Marin County Job Growth Rates






Household Growth Forecast, 2010-2040






Marin County Household Growth Rates

Marin Housing Need Over Time





Transportation Investments, 2010-2040



Discretionary Transportation Investments, 2010-2040





Local Control

SEC. 4. Section 65080 (J) ... Nothing in a sustainable communities strategy shall be interpreted as superseding the exercise of the land use authority of cities and counties within the region. ...

Nothing in this section shall require a city's or county's land use policies and regulations, including its general plan, to be consistent with the regional transportation plan ...
